Dear Student Athlete,

This is to confirm receipt of your registration for the July 20th New Student Athlete Orientation. We are happy that you will join us on the Berkeley campus from 10:00am until 2pm! Please read the following information carefully before attending the orientation.

Check-in will be held from 9:30-10am on the UC Berkeley campus outside of the east entrance of the Valley Life Sciences Building (VLSB), between VLSB and California Hall. You can access a campus map at: http://www.berkeley.edu/map. Coffee will be available during check-in time, with Orientation beginning promptly at 10am.

Students and parents will attend the same program at 10am, and then we will separate students from parents for different presentations and relevant break-out sessions. Presentations will end at 1pm, with lunch served between 1pm-2pm. Athletic Study Center Staff and Intercollegiate Athletics Staff will be available during the lunch hour to answer any questions that are not addressed between 10am and 1pm.

<u>Prior to July 20th:</u> The July 20th Orientation will provide practical advice about your academic and athletic experience at Cal. We will also describe the academic requirements with which you must comply in the course of your studies.

We will cover how to select and enroll in courses, but we expect you to have completed the preparation below.

Getting Started (http://orientation.berkeley.edu/before-you-arrive/getting-started):

- Log into Cal Central
- Create your CalNet ID and bConnected account
- Apply for Housing
- Submit Final Transcript

Golden Bear Advising (GBA) (http://orientation.berkeley.edu/before-you-arrive/golden-bear-advising):

- This is the first step in your Golden Bear Experience.
- Golden Bear Advising covers campus academic resources and serves as an introduction to your college. This information includes communication with your Academic Advisor, an overview of academic resources, graduation requirements, how to find and choose courses for your first semester, and how to enroll using the CalCentral My Academics tab. You will be be invited through a task in CalCentral to complete this portion of your Golden Bear Experience. Final assignments are due June 30th.
- You must complete Golden Bear Advising in order to connect with your College Academic Advisor and to enroll in classes.

Schedule Planning Webinar for Student Athletes in L&S (June 25th, 10-11am, PST)

This online session is designed for first semester student athletes and will be co-hosted by advisors from L&S and the Athletic Study Center. The following information will be covered: degree requirements, schedule planning specific for athletes, and campus resources targeted for students who will be balancing their sport with their studies. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions at the end of the webinar. Please check your email as the date nears - students will receive a link to register for the webinar via email.

• If you are unable to log-on during the 10-11am hour, it will be recorded for you to view after the live session.

Advising tips: Undergraduate students at Berkeley normally enroll in 15 units per semester in order to graduate in four years. This does not include AP units or summer course work. In your first semester students generally enroll in courses which will satisfy campus and breadth requirements, as well as lower division prerequisites for potential majors. Balance your program by enrolling in a variety of courses; we suggest taking no more than two similar courses per semester. Select alternative courses in case your first choices are unavailable.

We recommend that you complete the following requirements within your first two years:

- 1) AWPE (Analytical Writing Placement Exam) and the Reading & Composition requirements*
- 2) Foreign Language & Quantitative Reasoning requirements*
- 3) Lower division prerequisites for your major
- 4) Courses fulfilling the seven course breadth requirements
- 5) American Cultures requirement
 - * You may have already fulfilled some of these requirements based on your high school coursework and/or standardized test scores.
