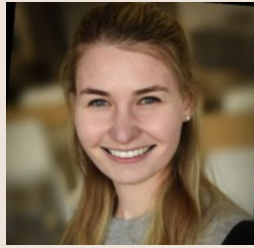

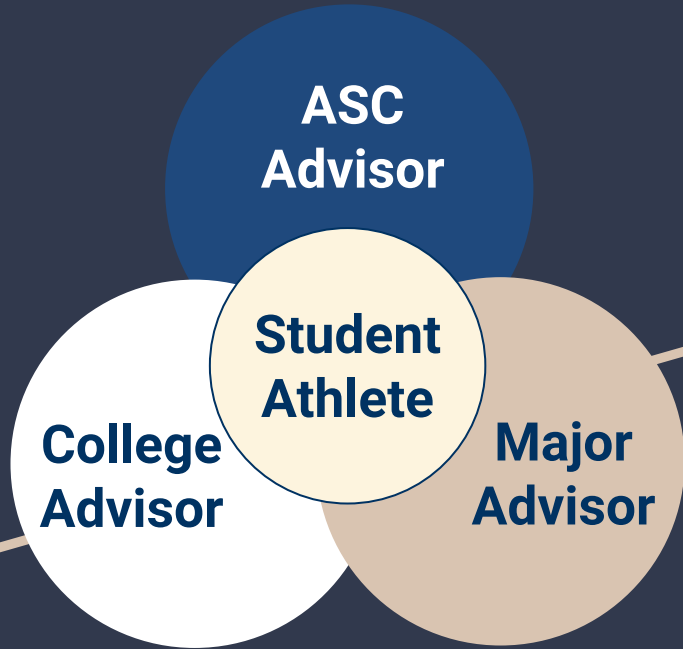

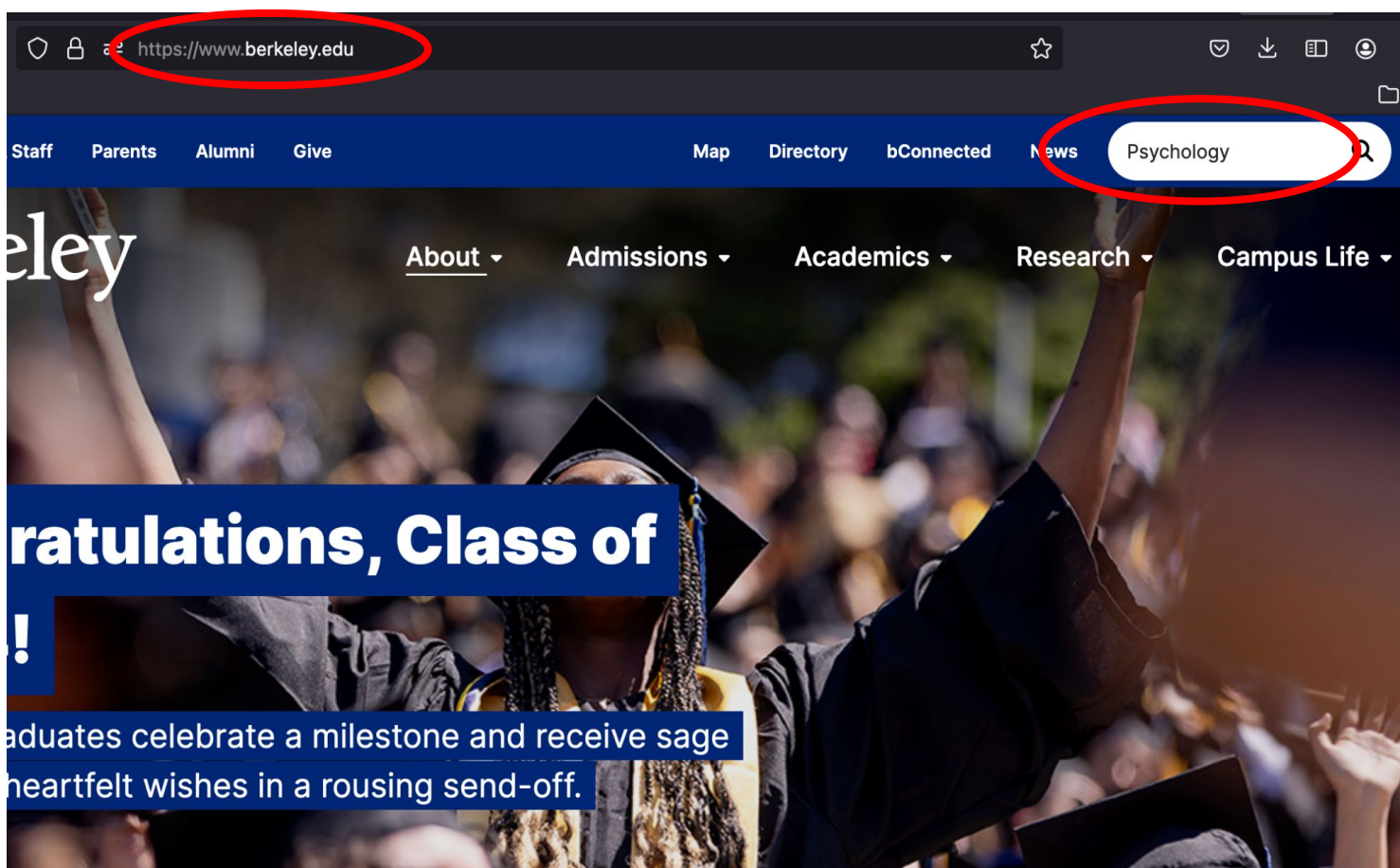

ALL courses taken for the major (both lower division prerequisites and upper division requirements) must be taken for a letter grade.

* We require a minimum of four letter-graded courses to satisfy prerequisites. If you take more than one AP exam or IBHL exam you may choose which one to use for the major prerequisites. The other four prerequisites must be satisfied with letter-graded courses.

- Complete a minimum of 60 semester units.
- Complete all major prerequisite courses listed below with a letter grade of C- or higher.
 - Note: Admission to the business major is competitive and highly selective. Grades in prerequisite courses are essential in helping us assess a student's ability to handle the academic rigor of the business major. Therefore the admission committee prefers that students take prerequisite courses for a letter grade. If you opt to take a prerequisite P/NP as allowed by your current college, the Haas admission committee will require that you submit a letter from the professor or the department stating what the letter grade would've been. Taking prerequisites P/NP or failing to submit a letter could adversely affect your admission decision.

Required Prerequisite Courses

- **Introductory Business (UGBA 10X) Requirement**

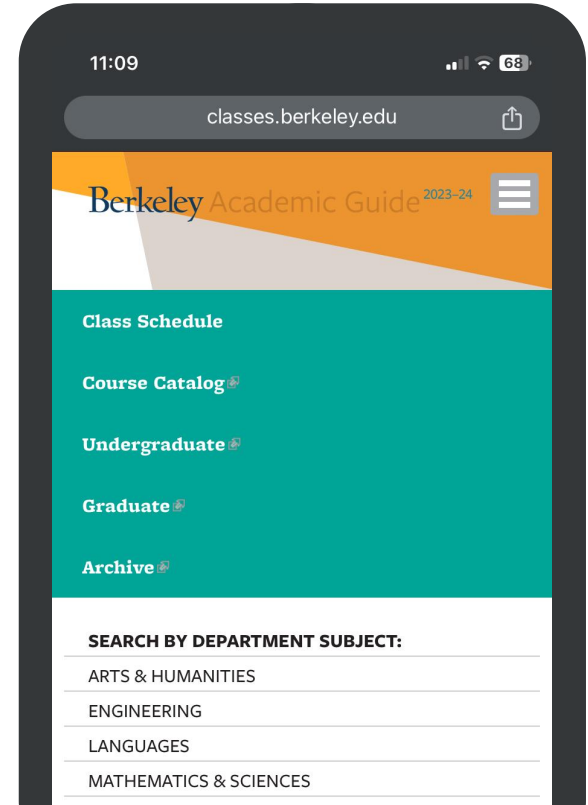

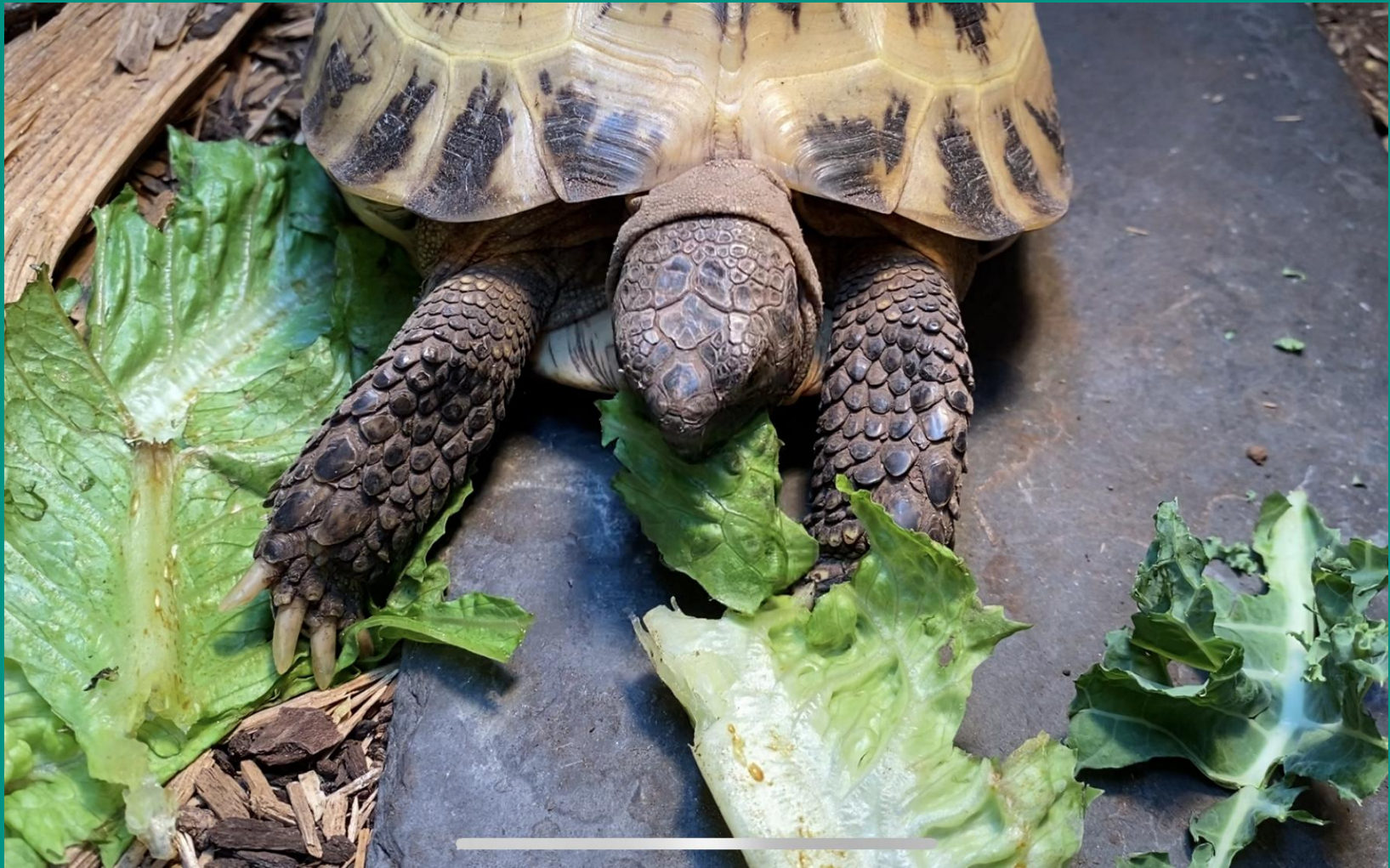



 - **Student athletes** should take into consideration:
 - Practice Schedules (ask coach or ASC advisor)
 - In-season / Out-of-season
 - Conflicts with traveling for competitions
 - Ed 98 (Scholar Athlete Transition Seminar)
 - Tues 11-1 or Tues 4-6 or
 - Wed 11-1 or Wed 4-6

Helpful hints

- If you enroll in 16 or 17 units, you can always drop a class and still be in 13 enrolled units for NCAA eligibility. You have 3.5 weeks to drop a class (except for a few Early Drop Deadline courses)
- In July, once you enroll in classes, CalCentral won't let you drop below 13 enrolled units (because you're coded as an athlete), but if you didn't show up to a lecture or a discussion section, the instructor can DROP you from their class! (Then you're temporarily "ineligible" and you have to enroll in another course; and what classes are still open the first week of school?)

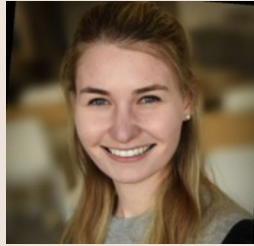
