

New Student Academic Checklist

- 1. Get your Cal1card (<u>https://cal1card.berkeley.edu/</u>)
- 2. Set up free campus wifi on your devices
 - a. Set up passwords (called login keys) for AirBears2 and bConnected: https://idc.berkeley.edu/mmk/
 - b. Use the passwords you created above to connect your phone and laptop to eduroam or AirBears2 (Campus Wi-Fi): https://technology.berkeley.edu/wi-fi
- 3. Set up email on your phone/devices (https://bconnected.berkeley.edu/)
 - a. Use your login key (see 2a. above) to get your Berkeley email on your phone it is important that you check your Berkeley email every day
- 4. Passwords store them in a safe place
 - a. Lastpass (https://www.lastpass.com/) is a free website where you can keep all your passwords
 - b. You will have to remember A LOT of passwords and want to keep them together
- 5. Download bCourses (Canvas) app
 - a. This will allow you to easily check bcourses (<u>https://bcourses.berkeley.edu/</u>) it is important that you check it **every day.** It includes the syllabus, class announcements, grades, upcoming assignments, etc.
- 6. Consider your tutoring needs
 - a. You can submit a tutor request at <u>https://asc.berkeley.edu/</u> when you arrive to campus
- 7. Meet with your ASC Advisor within the first two weeks of the semester
 - a. Check in with your College Advisor (L&S, CNR, CED, COC, COE) at least once within your first semester
- 8. Set up calendars (<u>https://bconnected.berkeley.edu/</u>)
 - a. Weekly schedule set up in Google calendar, include classes, practice, and tutoring
 - i. Sync calendar to phone
 - b. Semester calendar write important due dates (papers, tests, presentations) from your syllabi and your competition schedule
- 9. Google Drive folders (https://bconnected.berkeley.edu/)
 - a. Create new folder for current semester including a folder for each class
- 10. Get school supplies (Binder, dividers, pencils, pens, highlighters, planner)
- 11. Print at least 1 copy of each of your syllabi and keep them in your binder
- 12. Organize Binder with dividers, syllabi, calendars, etc.
- 13. Books
 - a. Your booklist can be found on CalCentral. Required readers will be listed in the syllabus
 - i. Books are available at the Cal Student Store in MLK Student Union
 - ii. Readers are available off campus: check syllabus for location
- 14. Disabled Students' Program (DSP) Follow up with a staff member if you need support registering with the DSP program (<u>http://dsp.berkeley.edu/</u>)
