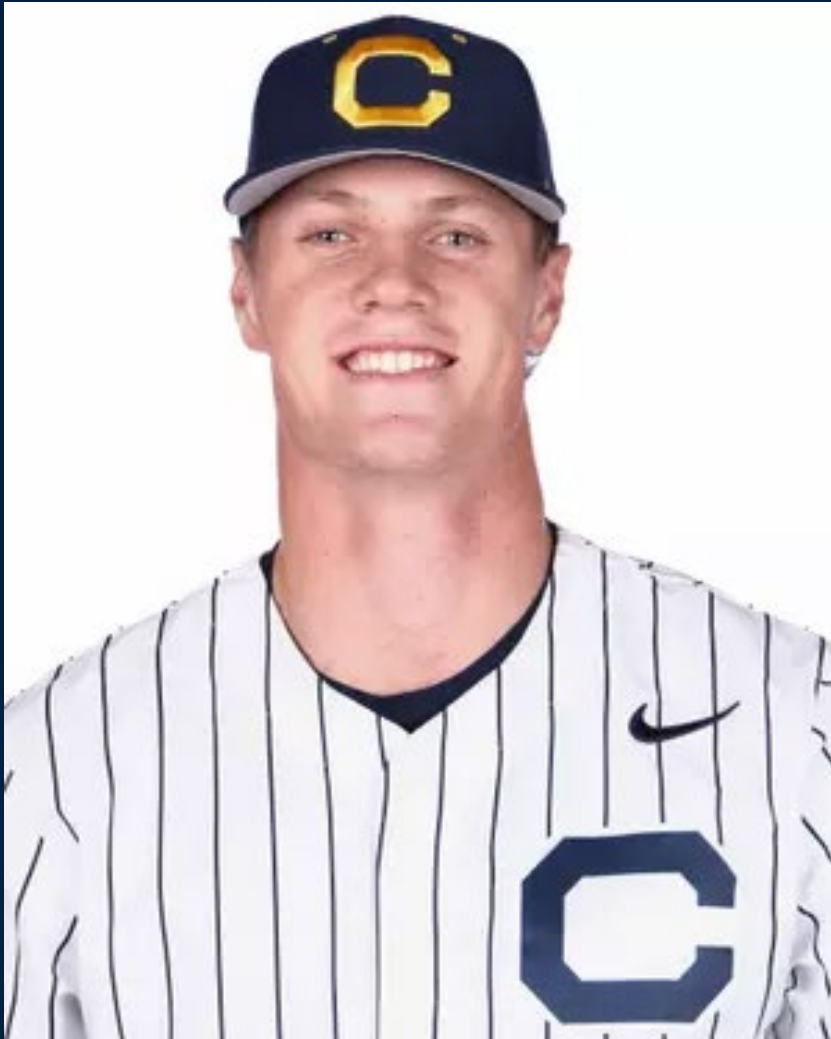




## **JAMBAR** *Scholar-Athlete* of the Week

She has mindfully tended to her interest in ecosystems and forestry by serving as an intern with the UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center, working collaboratively at Monitor Pass, taking soil moisture readings and watering flora as part of the Climate Resilient Forest Restoration Project, located in the Washington Fire area. Sydney has also dedicated time to serving as a volunteer with the Prison Education Project, teaching weekly courses on topics including building healthy relationships, healing, and forgiveness to incarcerated students at Halawa Correctional Facility; and assisting with an eight-week reintegration program for formerly incarcerated individuals, including resume building workshops and partnerships with banks and hiring managers. Recognized for engaging with programs and organizations on campus that expand research, fellowship, and public service skills, leveraging the knowledge and skills acquired within courses towards co-curricular opportunity paths. Beyond her stellar academic track, Sidney has worked as a Fundraising Coordinator with Cal Women's Rowing and Go 2 For Lung Cancer to raise over \$39,000 for the San Francisco 5K event in honor of a former teammate Jill Costello, encouraging over 250 people to join their efforts. She has also served as a Community Engagement Intern with the Cameron Institute, collaborating with fellow student-athletes on programs meant to improve literacy rates amongst elementary students and the Incarceration to College initiative to help incarcerated youth envision themselves in higher education and professional spaces. Sidney has dedicated time to her fellow peers by working as a tutor with the Athletic Study Center, focusing on English proficiency and writing skills development across various disciplines. In addition to her service at Cal, she attended a Study Abroad Program at the University of South Florida, where she learned how to sail a 112-foot schooner while exploring the field of Marine Sciences. Through this unique academic discovery experience, Sidney earned a rescue diver certification from PADI, International Competent Crew certification, VHF certification, EFR certification, and Navigation Master, that warranted being elected student captain, leading a crew of 22 into port in Bali, Indonesia by sailing over 5,000 nautical miles.
